



ANNUAL REPORT 2018

For 35+ years YSOP has prepared young people to develop a life-long commitment to serve others. Our programs engage youth in hands-on service to hungry and homeless people in New York and Washington, DC. YSOP participants prepare and serve meals in soup kitchens, help to distribute food, furniture and clothing, assist with recreation activities for children in family shelters, clean homes of low income seniors facing eviction, and host weekly dinners for homeless people. With adult guidance, orientation and time for reflection, students experience the challenges and rewards of service.

Some of the program highlights from fiscal year 2017-2018 include:

- Over 3,000 middle school, high school and college students and adults participated in 90 YSOP programs.
- Volunteers gave thousands of hours of service reaching more than 260,000 homeless and hungry people in New York City and Washington, DC
- YSOP welcomed diverse participants from 39 faith based groups, 18 college groups, and 46 middle and high school groups.
- Student volunteers traveled to YSOP from all over the United States and beyond, with recent groups coming from Kentucky, California, Ohio, Massachusetts, Minnesota, and Florida
